

Logistics industry is re-defining

Romania has been traditionally a market driven by automotive industry, due to the main cars manufacturer in the south, Dacia Renault, For a couple of years Ford plant in Craiova, taken over from the State in 2008, prepared for the real production in Romania and now we can really take advantage of two cars manufacturers with all the logistics and transport operations required. Even if the automotive industry is crossing a redefinition in Europe - with focus on electromobility, connectivity and car sharing services - the production in Romania is adapting quickly at these trends which will revolutionize the cars production. Tens of thousands of people lost the jobs already in German automotive industry because of the shift to electromobility and the move back has not finished yet. The maintenance and parts distribution will be also affected soon, while the logistics services offered to the automotive industry will also reconfigure. For the moment, the

low salaries in Romania compared to other European markets, the relative political stability and Brexit menace offer to our country good premises for at least maintaining the current development of the automotive business, if not further developments. New hybrid cars are manufactured here. new components for the electric cars are already delivered from Romania elsewhere, so the shift is felt also on our national market, still driven by diesel cars.

At the same time, we see for several years and now more than ever an increasing interest for electric vans, LNG trucks and intermodal, everything for a Zero Emissions transport and distribution. Aside to the automotive business, traditionally important for the Romanian market. e-commerce is now the drive for the biggest development on the logistics market: new warehouses openings, new IT and platforms developers, taking overs and consolidations of courier services market. The logistics market around the new online

retailers is booming and offers big room for development for new players, but also to the well-established ones. more known for groupage services. Everything relies on the capacity of re-defining all the time, because the "rules" are changing quickly and innovation and speed are the key characteristics for adapting to the new demands of the market. China is pushing the shift mostly, developing roads, trains and any possible way to bring their goods to Europe. Besides the direct investments in infrastructure, Chinese are also more present in the European transport industry taking over important logistics and transport providers in The Netherlands and not only. To keep the business alive, information and its analysis are more important than ever. And our TOP Romanian Logistics Operators is a piece of precious information to understand the Romanian transport and logistics market and not only.

Rising wages have affected profitability

The profit margin of the logistics companies continued to decrease in 2018 and the main factor that affected these companies was the increase of the costs with the employees, which may often not be included in time or even at all in contracts. Out of the top 500 logistics companies, 65 registered losses, compared to 59 in 2017, of which 29 were on the list of companies that registered profit in 2017. More than half of the top 500 logistics companies succeeded to increase the turnover in 2018, but only about 200 companies also increased their profit. Out of these, about 150 companies achieved a profit growth below €100,000, and of the other 50 only CEVA Logistics exceeded one million euros profit growth, followed by IB Cargo with €929,000.

s expected, the largest turnover belongs to Schenker Logistics, up 4% in 2018 compared to 2017. The company reported an increase of 15% for contract logistics and 10% for the volumes transported by road. However, the profit decreased by 42% compared to the previous year, reaching three million euros, after an increase of over 100% in 2017 compared to 2016. Although the company has constantly registered increases in operational activity, the variations of profits come from the remaining assets of the former Romtrans, where it has been trying to put order for several years. Thus, the company tries to sell those assets that it does no longer need operationally. Some of these were sold in 2017, influencing the profit growth by 116% compared to 2016. As for the difference between receivables and debts, it reached €15



million, 5% lower than in 2017. Also, in 2018 the company also registered a slight increase of 5% in total assets, reaching €66.7 million.

After taking over the logistic activity of a well-known restaurants chain which brought

many losses in 2017, Havi Logistics managed to recover in 2018. The company remained second in the list of logistics companies in terms of turnover, with €127 million, up 17% compared to the previous year. Havi managed to have a slight profit of €237,000, after a loss of half a million euros in the previous year. The company also recorded the largest increase in turnover in the Top 500 logistics companies. The assets also increased by 14%, reaching €20 million. The difference between the big turnover and the small profit comes from the fact that, for some customers, the company buys the products from the suppliers and resells them to restaurants at the same price, so that its profit margin comes only from the logistical operations performed.

Third place in this top is occupied by Transmec, which increased its turnover by 9% in 2018 compared to 2017, reaching €85 million. Increased interest in intermodal transport is also seen in Transmec's profit, which rose by 28%, reaching over two million euros. The company expanded its truck fleet in our country by 20 units, reaching 180. Currently, Transmec organizes its own trains on the Oradea-Zeebrugge routes (three trains a week, having as final destinations Great Britain and BeNeLux countries). Oradea-Piacenza and Oradea-Lodz (both twice a week) and public trains twice a week between Oradea and Duisburg. The company planed to open new intermodal lines in 2019 - Oradea-Ploiești, Oradea-Budapest and Oradea-Constanta - and it is studying the option of moving from Oradea to Stuttgart area. In addition, investments in this type of transport will continue by opening new own lines and by the purchase of specialized equipment (containers and mobile boxes).

▶ Gefco also increased its turnover in 2018 by 23%, reaching about €84 million, and its profit by 25%, up to two million euros. The company's assets increased by 48%, to €24 million.

Gebrüder Weiss has maintained the same growth rate of turnover in recent years, reaching €62 million in 2018, 5% up compared to 2017. On the other hand, the company's profit fell by 32%, reaching a million euros. And the assets remained constant, 29 million euros. The decrease in profit was explained by company representatives by increasing costs with salaries and equipment.

In sixth place, DSV Solutions had a 10% increase in turnover in 2018, up to €60 million, but also a 16% decrease in profit, reaching €1.5 million. The company's assets reached €18 million, a 7% increase compared to 2017, mainly equipment for the warehouse.

Quehenberger has maintained the same turnover in 2017, but transport activity has affected its financial figures, so in 2018 it lost €1.5 million. The company continued to reduce the fleet and it reached 150 trucks in 2018, and by the end of 2019 half of the vehicles were supposed to be returned to the leasing company.

Kuehne + Nagel had a slight increase in turnover in 2018, 7%, to €52 million. The company's profit grew by about €430,000, reaching €1.6 million. Assets increased by 7%, reaching €9.6 million.

Ranked 9th in this top, Yusen Logistics (former Tibbet Logistics) posted a turnover of about €49 million in 2018, up 16% compared to 2017. Profit, however, decreased by 34% until

€1.9 million, and assets increased by 19%, reaching €14.7 million.

The last in Top 10 logistics companies arranged according to the turnover is Gopet Romania, which increased its turnover by only 2% in 2018, reaching €43 million.

CEVA Logistics had the highest profit growth

Although it had a 41% drop in profit, Schenker Logistics was also the first in Top Profit in 2018, with €3 million, followed by Transmec, which in 2017 was 6th in this top, with €1,8 million. After a 28% profit growth, up to €2 million, Gefco was in third place in this top. IB Cargo an increase of 80% in profit, reaching €2.1 million, with a turnover of €31 million, 20% higher than in 2017. The result is explained by the increase of applications for the urgent flights by plane, but also by the total volumes. After DHL Logistics has grown steadily in recent years, in 2018 the company posted a slight decrease of €151,000. In decline was also the turnover, from €30 million to €22. Thus, the company went down from the 13th place in 2017 to the 20th in 2018. After acquiring Tibbett Logistics at the end of 2017,

Yusen Logistics placed in 2018 in sixth place in Top Profit, with a profit 34% lower than the profit of the company it bought a year earlier, which was in second place in the same top. The situation could be explained by the 19% increase in assets compared to the previous year, reaching about €15 million.

The seventh place in the same top is occupied by CEVA Logistics, which

increased its profit from €40,000 to €1.7 million, with a 55% increase of turnover, to €16.7 million, and an increase of assets with 50%, up to €5.4 million. The company also recorded the highest profit growth of the Top 500 logistics companies, €1.6 million, followed by IB Cargo, with a difference of almost one million euros compared to 2017. The following places in the top profits are occupied by Kuehne + Nagel, with €1.6 million, KLG Europe Logistics, with €1.6 million, and DSV Solutions, with €1.5 million. DSV Solutions came in 10th in Top Profit after decreasing its profit by 16% compared to 2017, while its assets increased by only 7%. The company, like the others, was strongly affected by the rising costs, especially those with wages.

Losses grow

The first place in the losses top was occupied in 2018 by FM Romania, which

registered €1.7 million, after the €97,000 loss in 2017. The company is affected by the €20 million investment it completing in Dragomirești, in 2017, a 20,000 sq.m. warehouse, half of which is dedicated to pharmaceuticals and half to cosmetics and FMCG. Competition in the pharmaceutical product logistics market has grown strongly in recent years, so there are already several large drug distributors that offer customers a wide range of logistics services. It is not excluded, however, that the company will also be affected by the changes on the management side in a very short time. Thus, after several good years in which the company was run by the Romanian Catalin Olteanu, he was replaced by the French Christoph de Korver, who, after only one year, was replaced by the Russian Alexander Pavlov. However, the company managed to attract customers in 2018, so that the turnover increased by 9%, reaching €28.8 ▶

million, and the assets by 19%.

Although in the top arranged by the turnover is on the 7th place, with a turnover of €54 million, Quehenberger Logistics is in second place in the Top of Losses, with €1.5 million, which has risen from €38,000 in 2017. As mentioned, the company has been severely affected by the transport activity it intends to reduce and to increase instead the logistics. The company is currently operating in a 150,000 sq.m storage space and plans to reach 200,000 sq.m by the end of 2020. Quehenberger Logistics became the logistics company operating the largest warehouse area in Romania.

After starting its activity in 2016, Raben Logistics Romania registered in 2018 losses of €1.3 million, ranking third in the Top Losses. On the other hand, the company's turnover almost doubled last year, reaching €5.6 million. The assets of the company also increased, reaching €1.6 million, from €1.2 million. The company's receivables reached €1.5 million and the debts reached €4.3 million.

Only 30 companies increased considerably their assets

Out of the top 500 logistics companies, only 293 increased their assets in 2018, out of which only 30 achieved an increase of over one million euros. The first company in top assets, as expected, is Karl Heinz Dietrich International, with total assets worth €102 million, up 27% in 2018. The turnover of the company reached €23 million, up 6% compared to 2017, and the profit reached €1.4 million, down 13% from the previous year.

The second place in this top is occupied by Schenker Logistics, which recorded in 2018 total assets of €66.7 million, followed by Transmec, whose value of the assets rose to €32.4 million, increasing by 21% compared to 2017,

Karl Heinz Dietrich is also the company that recorded the biggest increase in total assets last year, €21.4 million, followed by Gefco, with a difference of almost €8 million, and Transmec, with €5.5 million.

2018, a profitable year for Romanian couriers!

The Romanian courier market exceeded €845 million in 2018 and the development of online commerce - which has brought very large volumes for the postal and courier services - had the biggest contribution. It is impressive that, despite the inefficiency and outdated services, CN Posta Română remains the leading company, followed by the largest private company - FAN Courier - which in 2018 has reached a turnover of more than €147 million. Overall, the top 10 companies generated almost 90% of the total turnover.

n 2018, the Top 30 Postal and Courier service, one of the most dynamic economic sectors, where operate approximately 1,500 companies, generated a turnover of almost €820 million (excluding UPS Romania, who have not declared the figures), increasing by more than 10% compared to the same period in 2017. Following the trend of the last years, the growing was given by domestic online retail, because many companies find it difficult to cope with the demand for logistics and transport services, especially from online stores.

The turnover of the top companies

Despite the logistical and personnel problems it faces, Posta Română continues to be the main player in the field. The company owned by the Romanian state through the Ministry of Communications (75%) and by Fondul Proprietatea (25%) registered in

2018 a turnover of €249,533,855 million, with a slight increase - just 1% - over the same period in 2017. The explanation for such a large



turnover is that a large part of this income comes from the payment of pensions. In addition, the State company benefits of the largest national distribution network, more that 5,500 postal subunits in the whole country, distributing more than 11 million postal items weekly. In total, based of its own data, over 19 million inhabitants benefit from the services of the company. This efficiency in terms of turnover was realized with basically the same average number of employees - 23,404 - like in 2017, decreasing with 836 people from 2016.

FAN Courier Express, which is ranked second, being the largest privately-owned company in the market, had a turnover of over €147 million, up €19.1 million (15%) compared to 2017. The growth was made possible with an average number of 2.738 employees, an increase with 265 people, despite the lack of work force in the market especially blue-collars. As we found out from the company's Chief Commercial Officer, Cornel Morcov, the main problems regarding personnel are in Cluj County, "where we have to fulfil every week with dozens of couriers, handlers, even managers from Bucharest and sometimes even from other locations". To solve a part of this deficit, FAN Courier has started The FAN SCHOOL, a

project to form people with less or no skills and train them for the company's needs.



The top is completed by third-placed Urgent Cargus, with a turnover of €91.3 million, up by nearly 12% compared to 2017, when it registered €81.6 million. With a 38% increase in turnover - €76,7 million - TNT ranks fourth, exceeding the German company DHL, who was fifth, with €62,1 million. Next position is held by GLS General Logistics Systems Romania, the courier company from Sibiu, with nearly €36 million, while UPS Romania ranks seventh with €35,1 million, down a position from 2017. The ranking is completed by DPD Romania with almost €30 million, up by €2.6 million (about 10%). In the last couple of years, the company has invested a lot in resources to improve performance, from changes of operational software to new services for clients, up to internal processes reorganization. The following places are occupied in order by Nemo Expres Logistic with an 22% increase to the ninth place - €26.7 million - and Delivery Solutions, which has the most

spectacular increase
 109% - up to €18.7 million.

Noteworthy that the top 10 companies in the courier market have a cumulative turnover of over €773 million, which represents almost 90% of the market, while on the following positions, from 11 to 30, there are companies with a total turnover of €81.5 million.




Analysing the data of all 30 companies, we note that seven of them have experienced losses in terms of difference between claims and debts. Moreover, the claims in 2018 are higher than the ones in 2017, which make us assuming that payment terms have increased.

The difference between claims and debts for all the companies analysed is over €174.49 million, with an improved balance over 2017. Thereby, the difference between those two years is about €13.5 million in favour of 2018. The company with the biggest debts is Poșta Română - over €100 million - although the number is smaller than previous year. Also, the State-owned company have claims of almost €34 million. The second place in terms of debts is held by a big player, Urgent Cargus, with about €52.26 million in minus, but with €14 million in claims. FAN Courier, the largest player in the market, holds third position with €33.16 million, while has to recover €18.36 million in claims.

Rising fleets, same losses

With a wide national network, FAN Courier constantly invests in his own fleet,



and the amount in 2018 was 19% over 2017, to about €10.7 million. With total assets of €194 million, Posta Română has current assets worthing €47.8 million, with an increase over 2017 of almost €4 million. Delivery Solutions, the company that

operates the Sameday Courier brand and part of the eMAG group, recorded an increase in his fleet of 151%, to nearly €6.2 million from €2.45 million to years before. Last places are occupied by Fastius Curier - a decrease of 13% compared to 2017 - and Pascal SRL, with just over €208,000 and €109,177 respectively.

In terms of another key term,
Profitability, FAN Courier records the most
dynamic growth, with nearly €17.2 million
in profits in 2018, which are reinvested by
the three shareholders, followed by Poṣta
Romānā, which had a net profit of €8.25
million in 2018 and GLS General Logistics
Systems Romania, with almost €6.8 million.

The total profit is €45.6 million, of which 90% is made by the first 10 companies, a 39% plus compared to 2017.

Last, but not least, only seven players reported minuses for a total of about €8.4 million which is about the same figure as in 2017. As then, the biggest losses are held by Delivery Solutions Company from Bucharest, with a minus that almost doubled at €6.19 million. At long distance is Urgent Cargus with €778,905 and Posta Atlassib Curier Rapid, which records a loss of a €566,902, an improvement compared to 2017, when the net loss was about €900,000.



Profit growing, but far from the values in 2015 and 2016

The first 20 companies as turnover obtained in 2018 had a total of €1,184,653,456 - compared to €1,057,3223,469 in 2017 - that is 24.28% of the total turnover of the operators on Top 500, while the total amount achieved last year in Romanian transport was €10.3 billion. Most leading companies talk about cost increases that they could not fully cover from tariff increases, but increasing volumes and maximizing efficiency have resulted in an increase (very small in 2018, from €50,187.748 to €51,623,959) for the total profit of the operators in Top 20. The first 20 companies with the highest turnover have almost 11.5% of the total turnover obtained by all the transport companies in the country, while the same companies add up to 10% of the total net profit obtained at industry level.

But we should analyse this data taking into account that Carrion did not publish the financial statement for 2018.

The first place in the top of the transport operators by turnover in 2018 belongs to Aquila Part Prod Com, with €209,402,406, 5% over the value of 2017 - €198,844,241. The company has grown steadily over the last four years, from €151,732,912 registered in 2015.

On second place in the ranking is Vos Logistics Cargo, with €110,677,160, compared to €80,606,728 in 2017 (an increase of 37%). In 2014, the Dutch

shareholders of Vos
Logistics began to transfer
the management of the
international transport
activities from the
Netherlands to Romania,
a process which ended
in 2018. Now there are
three separate entities:
Vos Logistics Bulk (10th in
the Top 20 according to
the turnover of 2018, with
€42,906,419, compared to

€1,283,189 in 2017), Vos Logistics Cargo and their shareholder Vos Logistics Romania (16th place in Top turnover of 2018, with €36,796,235, compared to €37,799,552 in 2017). The transfer did not affect the results of the group, but, on the contrary, the turnover increased in 2018 by 8%. Progresses exist both on the international transport segment, as well as on the solutions and services, in parallel with a doubling of the net profit, in comparison with 2017, from €3.5 to €6.7 million. From the total turnover of the company - €140 million for freight and €50-60 million for bulk goods - last year the part of the Romanian branch

amounted to €37 million.
Shipments represent 20%
of this activity, groupage
transport 5% (more in
Belgium) and international
transport 75%. Out of the
185 vehicles registered in
Romania, 50 are specialized
for bulk goods and the rest
for general merchandise. In
addition to its own fleet, Vos
Logistics also works with

vehicles, and use Vos Logistics semitrailers. The trucks fleet registered in Romania is used mostly in the Community, about 85% returning to international transport and too little to the groupages. But the vehicles also do national transport. The company has 457 employees (330 drivers and 127 indirectly productive personnel), even though the Romanian branch was established in 2012 from scratch.

In third place in this top is Duvenbeck, with €82,680,353, 12% above the value in 2017, of €73,552,011, and with constantly increasing results in the last four years. The Braşov company was also in third place in 2017 in this ranking, but after Carrion, so if the Spanish-origin carrier would have released the financial results and they would have been in tune with those in 2017, Duvenbeck would have relegated a position, because of the rise of Vos Logistics.

In fourth place is Internațional Alexander, which is one place up from 2017 and reaches €69,591,739, 25% more than in the previous year (€55,702,200). The turnover of the company from Arad

has increased year by year in the last five years, but in 2018 it has increased more compared to 2017, because the new fleet was acquired, which brought added value and the possibility of gaining new transport volumes. "In addition, we have new partners who work constantly with us, subcontractors and traction contractors, and the warehousing and logistics services directly in customer factories have also generated a growing turnover", stated Loredana Apreutese, general manager of the company. And in 2019 will also appear the results of the transport of vehicles. In 2018 the demand for transport and logistics registered an explosive growth. The key element that determined this is the increase of consumption, respectively of production. International Alexander specialized every year in the automotive sector, an innovative and complex industry, it was open to change and remained in close contact with customers, in order to identify the necessary solutions for a well-defined flow, customized solutions, leading to optimization, both in transport and logistics. "2018 has been, more than ever, a year of reinvention, adaptability and strategy, a dynamic environment, which requires a future-oriented attitude." The company was organized as a holding of 10 independent companies, in order to have a good image on the efficiency of each activity in the logistics chain. For 2018 there is no consolidated balance

sheet of the 10 entities, but International Alexander (the transport company) had a turnover of 323,601,588 lei, International Alexander Logistic had 8,569,169 lei, and International Alexander Line Spedition (dealing with vehicle transport), 1,755,757 lei. That is 85% of the turnover comes from transport and 15% from logistics. The decision to set up companies in Serbia, Hungary and Germany and to promote the services abroad has led the company to new opportunities. International Alexander Holding, having Simion loan Apreutese as CEO and shareholder, has ISO 9001, 14001, 18001, 45001, AEO, TSR3 certification, it is currently being certified for TSR1 and it has a portfolio of services including FTL transport, LTL, groupages, distribution, air, maritime, vehicle transport, warehousing & logistics services, professional packaging washing and logistics directly in customer factories. The company also has clients for domestic transport, as package with the international, and it has direct contracts with several clients, especially from the south and west of the country, without more than 10% exposure for any of them, "which it was also helpful to us in mixing the trips, besides the stability we tried to keep as we were not dependent on a certain partner."

The fifth place belongs to Skiptrans, the Cluj branch of the Belgian company Jost (seventh place in 2017), with €61,433,134, 37% above the €44,926,830 in 2017. The difficult situation caused by the charges

▶ brought to the Belgian employer and the seizure of 346 trucks from Romania could have led to the closure of the business, especially since the company had to pay the salaries and taxes corresponding to the 346 drivers and leasing rates. Indeed,

Skiptrans lost some customers, but their number was small enough not to affect the financial results. On the contrary, the total volumes increased by taking over new customers and by developing the internal transport activity, where 15 trucks are now working, and by the end of 2019 it was planned to reach 40. In the next 1-2 years it is estimated that 20% from the activity will be represented by national trips, especially groupages. 80% of transport orders are based on fixed contracts, in order to be predictable. The fleet in Romania has been extended from one year to another, in 2019 already 150 trucks were registered, and the number was supposed to reach 200 units by the end of the year, of which 90 vehicles are Iveco LNG, out of a total of 500 units ordered throughout the Jost group.

On the next place is Paneuro
International, a new company entered in the Top 20, following an increase of turnover from €6,274,224 in 2017 to €58,599,174 in 2018. An unusually high value compared to those from previous years, €4-7 million. And, because the company did not make any profit, on the contrary, it had one of the biggest losses in the industry in 2018, we decided to eliminate it from the Top 20. Thus, on the sixth place is XPO Transport Solutions (fourth place in 2017), with €55,353,217, decreasing from €60,526,992 in 2017.

Dolo Trans Olimpic is this time in seventh position, up from the 13th a year ago, due to an increase from €38,668,521 to €52,161,984 (+35%). The turnover was higher in 2018 because the company mobilized better, as the general manager



Cristian Dolofan says, also having the experience of the previous years in which it was hit by the same instability, legislative changes and decisions made from one day to another, which leads to a lack of predictability. "We decided not to set any goals from the beginning of the year, but we first tested the ground and mobilized when we saw that we could start investments." In the second part of the year, when freight transport stopped, the company focused on extending the car storage platforms and the car-carrier fleet. The increase of the turnover in 2018, to a greater extent than the increase of the previous years, was due to the fact that the company developed on several fields, the fleet was 80 assemblies bigger than in 2017, the storage spaces became functional and extended service activity. The profit increased in 2018 for the same reasons and, if the transport market stalled at the end of 2018, the compensation came from the storage activity, on a platform with a 1,500-2,000 vehicles capacity and a reserve for another 1,500. So that the company will continue to rely on the development of new products and services and the improvement of existing ones, precisely to bring added value. The fleet will be constantly extended and the company will invest in buy back every five years, which is efficient because the costs are lower than those caused by the eventual maintenance of older trucks. As for 2019, the strategy of the past year has been maintained and therefore the results were expected to be very good. In 2018, the company bought 40 Lohr Megatrailer superstructure trucks, Mercedes-Benz representative service is operational and serves a greater number of customers, and

the route efficiency program implemented in 2017 continues to deliver results. Among the main challenges that 2020 will bring there are, as Cristian Dolofan considers, the ethics of business partners, the losses caused by the unserious, bad-paying clients - "which is why we started to focus on developing the relationships with the clients we work with from the beginning and to rely less on expanding the portfolio with partners we do not know"- and the longer payment term.

In eighth place is Gartner Eurotrans, with \in 49,927,725, compared to \in 39,898,409 in 2017, when it was on the 11th place. On the ninth is Arcese Transport, down from the sixth in 2017, with an increase of 1%, from \in 8,344,163 to \in 48,682,881, and the 10th position, as we said, is occupied by Vos Logistics Bulk.

On the 11th place in the top of transport operators according to the turnover in 2018, as in 2017, is Dianthus Company, with €40,942,437, compared to €39,685,622 in the previous year. The slight increase is due to the acquisition of 50 new trucks, some of which were for fleet renewal, and some for expansion. The figures, including profit, could have been much better if the company had not experienced excessive driver migration in the second half of the year, which meant that 10-15% of the fleet would not work. "Even under these conditions, we honoured all the transport orders", says Dan Niculescu, the transport manager of the Pitesti company, "but we

could not increase the customer portfolio and the transport volumes". After the winter holidays, however, the situation has improved considerably - "it seems that the drivers are convinced that the difference in income is not very big if they work abroad compared to Romania and, in addition, that they do not come home as often", and they returned to the country - so Dianthus could use all the trucks again. The turnover of the company increased in 2018 and 2019 also for domestic transport (this represents less than 10% of the total turnover). Here Dianthus uses a dedicated fleet consisting of about 30 trucks that work mainly for the automotive industry. As for the near future, Dan Niculescu is not worried about the Mobility Package, because it will take time before it is adopted, "but what concerns us is the political-economic situation in Europe. It seems that a new crisis is coming, there are already signs in Germany, which is why we do not make any investment plans."

Following is Ravitex, in the 12th place, with €39,899,187, a very slight decrease from the €40,087,725 in 2017, when it was in the 10th place. Microfruits, with €38,903,727, up 26% from the €30,990,315 in 2017, is not taken into account in this top, because the turnover in transport represents less of the total activity consisting mainly in distribution and trade, and its own fleet is small. That is why on the 13th place is International Lazăr Company, with €38,543,283, 8% less than the previous year,

when it had €41,733,366 and was ninth. Following H.Essers, with €38,181,838, 12% more than the €34,106,597 in 2017, when he ranked 17th, Dunca Expediții, with €37,905,759, 7% more than the €35,563,156 in 2017, when it was on 15th place, and Vos Logistics Romania.

Total N S A is on the 17th place - much lower than in

➤ 2017, when it was on the eighth - with €36,341,212, 15% less than the €42,694,834 from the previous year.

Dumagas is 18th, up 8% from the €33,028,494 in 2017, to €35,773,584. The growth was similar to 2016 in 2017, given that the fleet was not larger, but the acquisitions were only to replace the last Euro 5 trucks for domestic transport and for transport in Central and Eastern Europe with Euro 6 trucks for transport in Western Europe. 50% of the increase in turnover is due to the internal transport department, 25% to the international one, 15% to the storage and logistics at controlled and ambient temperature and 10% to the sales of old trucks, because in 2018 the project of renewing the fleet, started in 2014, was completed, 63% of the turnover in 2018 comes from international transport, including cars or industrial gas (nitrogen, oxygen, carbon dioxide), for which the company has 39 assemblies. Another 25% come from domestic transport with two-temperature own vans, towed by the vehicles of other companies, 6% from logistics and 6% from other activities, given that in 2017 the international had a share of 65%, the internal, 23% and the other activities, 6% each. The profit in 2018 was €236,646, compared to the one declared in 2017, €100,000, and it was divided between transport (60%), storage and distribution (25%) and sale of trucks (25%). As noted by Lucia Apostol, Chief of Operational Excellence at Dumagas, 2018 was a year of changes in the transport



market compared to 2015-2017. The domestic transport registered spectacular growth, based on the increase of consumption, and the companies that could manage the necessary capacity had gained. At the intra-Community level, the demand was similar to the one of the previous years, but the increase of the fuel price, by about 11% compared to 2017, and the lack of drivers, which attracted another cost increase, of at least 10%, made the profit from this activity much lower than in 2017, as the tariff increase only covered 50% of the cost. In order to counterbalance the effects of the costs, better transport planning was done, the routes were re-analysed and the unprofitable ones were given-up, some routes were re-offered, the loads were optimized and cash management was better. On the other hand, in the second half of the year the negative effects of the future Brexit and the Mobility Package were reflected in media and, in addition, for Dumagas, the economic situation of Turkey caused the company to close the dedicated transport division in this country, which had been developed in the last 10 years. The Craiova operator invested in 2019 in 30 Mercedes-Benz Actros Euro 6 trucks to replace the old Euro 5, in 50 new Renault Trucks and MAN trucks to renew the 2015 fleet and in 25 new Schmitz semitrailers for which it has called for operational and financial leasing. It also sold old trucks worth about €100,000 in 2018, continuing to do so in 2019, which increases its profits.

The ranking ends with Practicom, in 19th place, with a turnover of €35,223,142, 36% higher than in 2017, and with J.T. Group Oil, with €34,021,309, 27% more than in 2017.

Only four companies in Top 20 in terms of turnover registered a lower value in 2018 than in 2017: Vos Logistics Romania (-3%), Internațional Lazăr Company (-8%), XPO (-9%) and Total NSA (-15%).

32 transport companies had a profit of more than €1,000,000 in 2018 and, leaving aside Carrion, which in 2017 was seventh in this ranking, the profit of the 20 most profitable companies in 2018 was €51,623,959, slightly above the value of €50,187,748 registered by the 20 most profitable companies in 2017 (which are not exactly the same as those in the Top 20 in 2018; the 20 top companies in 2018 had a total profit of €45,098,751 in 2017). On the first place in this top there is a traditional presence, Transpeco Logistics & Distribution, with €6,760,778, compared to €7,166,241 in 2017. The decrease is caused by the fact that the increase of tariffs did not cover in certain periods of the

year the increase of prices, such as wages and fuel. 70-80% of the profit comes in 2018 from operational activities and the rest from the sale of trucks and from financial placements, a percentage that, too, maintained from one year to another. In 2018, Transpeco had a turnover of €25,079,651, slightly rising compared to the €23,749,925 in 2017, due to the increase in volumes transported for some customers and the slightly higher tariffs. But as a whole, 2018 has been in line with the previous years for the transport of petroleum products, as the company executive director Dragos Gâdoiu declares, because both the major fuel suppliers and the specialized carriers

are about the same and these companies have understood that sustainability can be achieved only by making investments: suppliers of products have to do investments for increasing their quality and transport operators have to invest in fleet and state-of-the-art equipment. The turnover of 2019 was expected to be slightly increasing compared to 2018 due to the additional volumes contracted and the tariffs 5% above the level of 2017.

Euro Fleet Transport is in second place, with €5,278,143, a substantial increase, 107%, compared to 2017, when it had €2,551,219 and was in sixth place.

In third place among the most profitable transport operators in Romania is Dianthus, with €3,509,463, decreasing (because of the lack of drivers in the second part of the year) compared to €4,343,268 in 2017, when it ranked second. The turnover registered in the first half of 2019 is at the same level as in 2018, given that 25 new Mercedes-Benz trucks were purchased for both the renewal and the expansion of the fleet. But profitability is lower primarily because of increased driver costs and road taxes and of tariffs that have not increased. "What affected us most in 2019 were the cost for drivers' accommodation at the hotel. Basically, they stay at the hotel in all countries - Germany, France, Spain, Italy, Belgium, Netherlands - and in Germany, for example, you can't find a room for less than €100. We try to accommodate 2-3 drivers in one room, but this implies additional dislocations, not covered in the transport price", says Dan Niculescu. In addition, in recent years, since drivers are paid per day, their productivity and the average number of kilometres travelled by trucks have decreased, as employees are no longer motivated to use their driving program efficiently. The profit for 2018 came largely from the operational activities and to a very small extent from the sale of trucks, because the demand in this segment has decreased much. As for the profit from domestic transport, it was significantly smaller, but it does not have a significant share in the total profit of the company.

In the fourth place is International Alexander, with €3,506,251, up 12% from the €3,127,258 in 2017. International Alexander has grown in 2018 compared to 2017 in terms of profit, but not as much as in the last years. Divided by companies, the net profit was 16,304,068 lei for International Alexander, 1,175,244 lei for International Alexander Logistic and 254,501 lei for International Alexander Line Spedition. So, the margin is bigger in case of logistics than in case of transport. The profit of the company is mostly influenced by the operational activities, both the expenses related to the current activity and the amortization of investments, and it has not increased to the same extent as in previous years because the company had a lower margin compared to the own fleet. "But I think it is necessary that our subcontractors and tractionists have the opportunity to support their expenses and to have a profit." The increase of the assets made the expenses with the depreciation increase, which diminished the rate of profit increase. The expenses that increased the most in 2018 are those with diesel, labour and road taxes. The latter ones and, partially, the fuel were assimilated by the customers by increasing the tariffs, and the costs with the employees were partially covered by internal optimizations and partially not covered, which affected the profit. The company made a profit, but not significantly compared to the total profit, also from the sale of 20 trucks from 2013. And in 2019 it was expected to maintain the profit from 2018, although the labour costs have increased last year.

Eugen Trans occupies the fifth position, with €3,160,683, up 229% from the

▶ €959,904 in 2017, when it was not in Top 20. The sixth company in profitability is Fartud, with €2,980,443, down 3% from the €3,057,236 in 2017. Skiptrans follows in ranking, with €2,932,221, 10% more than in 2017, when it had a profit of €2,663,429 and was fifth, Aguaki Trans, with €2,690,151, 1,062% more than in 2017, when it had €231,601 and it was not in Top 20, Duvenbeck Logistik, with €2,419,427, 19% more than the €2,028,011 in 2017, when it took the 14th place, and in the tenth position is Microfruits, with €1,989,922, 22% above the €1,635,685 in 2017.

On the second part of the ranking, the 11th place belongs to Royal Trans, with a profit of €1,987,452, 2% less than in 2017, when it occupied the 13th place, followed by Vio Transgrup, with €1,944,081, 7% less than in 2017, when it was still in 12th place. Last year the company made operational its own warehouse of 2,000 sq.m, thus completing the transport services offered to the customers, and among the plans for the next period is the construction of another centre, 10,000 sq.m, authorized by TAPA FSR, and the purchase of distribution vans, in order to cover the entire logistics chain. The warehouse activity has been profitable since the second month of operation, and the turnover was €460,000 after the first six months, with 16 customers. The company had, at the end of 2018, 191 20 tons trucks - 60 own and the rest of dedicated subcontractors - and 27 own units, all Scania, were purchased in 2018 for the partial renewal of the fleet. The plan is that



at the end of 2020 its own fleet number 100 trucks of 20 t, all for transport of high values. The volumes on this segment have doubled from year to year, starting in 2014, since the company offers this service, and the trend continues.

In the 13th place is Agexim Spedition, with €1,891,216, up 66% from the profit in 2017, when the company was not in Top 20, the 14th is Logistic E Van Wijk, with €1,844,013, 25% below the value of 2017, when it ranked eighth, and the 15th is Binar Speed Exclusive, with €1,519,483, 3% above the value of the previous year, when it was on the 18th. The 16th position is occupied by Trans Euro Express 94, with €1,512,630, down by 35% compared to 2017, when it was on the ninth place, and the 17th, by Port Trans, with €1,434,580, 2% less than in 2017, when it was in 19th place.

In the 18th place is Maracana, with €1,432,678, 2% more than in the previous year, when it was on the 20th. The turnover of the company increased last year by 22% compared to 2017, up to about 13 million euros, due to the efficiency of the trips and the fact that the investment of 1.5 million euros in its own warehouse on the Timisoara ring-road became operational in 2018, with the takeover of the logistics and local transport for Coca Cola HBC Romania, whose goods occupy about 99% of the total area of 5,000 sq.m. Maracana transports the goods from the factory in Timisoara, but also makes the local transport to the key accounts' platforms. Transport contributes with about 70% to the turnover of the company and most of the activity is related to Germany, where volumes have increased quite a lot in 2018 both for import / export and intra-Community trips. In 2018, the company also started the domestic transport, with five trucks traveling to Austria and then in Romania, and in 2019 five others joined them. 2018 also brought a reconfiguration of the trips, in order to optimize costs, especially those with diesel

and wages, which few customers accept to cover entirely. All these solutions, combined with an increase of the other activities of the company, construction and agriculture, led to a 22% increase in turnover and 2% in profit.

In the 19th place is Express Euroscan, with €1,417,821, 2% above the value of 2017, when it was not in Top 20 by profit, and the ranking ends with Rozoti Prodcom, with €1,412,523, down 9% from 2017, when it was 17th.

Nine companies out of the first 20 in terms of profit had a lower value than in 2017, with percentages between 2% (Port Trans and Royal Trans) and 35% (Trans Euro Express 94).

A new leader in the Loss ranking

Two transport companies have losses of over two million euros, other three, more than one million euros, and the rest up to 20th place between €610,623 and €982,926. The first place in the ranking of the biggest losses is Klacska (in second place in 2017 after XPO Transport Solutions), with €2,862,418, with an insignificant decrease, 1%, compared to the value of 2017. The ranking continues with Paneuro International, with €2,616,012, which in 2017 had a profit of €99,070, Kraft Logistic, with €1,266,934, compared to €38,141 in 2017, B.H.L. Logistic, with €1,222,507, down 56% from the loss in 2017, when it was third in this ranking, and ATP Transit, with €1,076,286, up 77% compared to the loss in 2017, when he was in 10th place.

The sixth place is Carpat Beton Servicii Pompe, with €982,926, up 23% compared to the loss in 2017, when it was ninth, and the seventh, Rodbun Cargo, with €879,505, decreasing by 17% compared to the loss in 2017, when it was in the same position. Auto Milli had a loss of €804,270 in 2018, 132% higher than in 2017, when it occupied the 18th position, and it is now in the eighth place. Henrik Hansen is ninth, with €748,590, 45% more than in 2017, when it was 11th, and the Top 10 ends with a new company, Whiteland Logistics, with €717,044 (this company had a profit of €65,006 in 2017).

On the 11th place is Transporturi Auto, with €696,970 (this company had a profit of €78,796 in 2017), followed by Frigoexpres, with €695,705, a 36% decrease from the loss in 2017, when it was in the sixth place, Omsan Logistica, increasing by 1,770% compared to 2017, up to €680,698, EPA Transport, with €633,115, 127% more than in 2017, when it was not in the Top 20 operators with the highest losses, and by Gartner Eurotrans, with €612,587, 27%

more than in 2017, when it was in 13th place.

The ranking ends with Trans Sese, with a loss of €560,599, 130% higher than in 2017, when it was not in the Top 20, XPO Transport Solutions, the leader in 2017, with €550,562, down 81% compared to the previous year, FS Transportservice, with €455,825, up 997% compared to the loss of €41,570 in 2017, Alosco, €429,541 (in 2017 the company had a profit of €30,672) and in the 20th place is Vimatra, with €428,699, an increase of 1,806% compared to the €22,496 loss in 2017.

Top 20 assets in 2018 have a lower value than in 2017

The first 20 transport companies in 2018 according to assets have a total of €631,801,417, compared to €688,257,392 the first 20 operators in the 2017 top. Since we do not have information about Carrion, which in 2017 was the first company in Top active, we note that the first 10 companies in the top 2018 appear also among the

top of 2017, although in another order, and four other companies (Romstyl Impex, Dianthus Company, Euro Fleet Transport and Trameco) appear in the Top 20 in both years. New entries in 2018 are Skiptrans, Vos Logistics Cargo, Holleman Special Transport, Dunca Expediții, Trans Euro Express 94 and Ravitex.

On the first place in Top 20 assets is Aquila, with €92,998,398, up 14% from €81,381,004 in 2017, when it ranked second after Carrion. The company from Ploieşti is followed at big distance by International Lazăr Company, with €59,718,958, in slight decrease, by 1%, compared to the €60,294,418 in 2017, when it was in third place, by Dolo Trans Olimpic, with €57,171,056, 31% over the €43,582,270 in 2017, when it was

in fifth place, and by International Alexander, with €49,947,030, 24% more than in 2017, when it was in sixth place. The company

invested in 2018 in the renovation and expansion of the fleet with about 100 vehicles and in a field in Sebes, where a logistics warehouse will be built, and started the projects for the investments in Giarmata (here the Class A warehouse has already been completed in the meantime and by the end of the year the operations of warehousing and logistical services were supposed to begin), Sibiu and Bucharest. The class A warehouse finalized in Arad is functional and productive and it has space for professional washing of packaging. Also in Arad was completed the parking for its own fleet and the service. In addition to logistical projects in its own warehouses, International Alexander is active in projects directly in customer factories and its team, together with the LEAN management of the company, managed, together with the customers, to record very good results and to optimize operations. International Alexander has also purchased plots for an intermodal terminal and it is waiting to obtain the necessary permits for this segment. The company intends to renew part of the fleet in 2020 and to extend it, in parallel with the increase of the number of subcontractors and traction contractors, because, having projects in progress for the next 3-4 years, it is not expected to be affected by the decrease in volumes. Nor does it reject the idea of hiring non-EU drivers, in order to have additional work force and balance in the behaviour of certain drivers. Moreover, the instability on the labour market is the reason why it was difficult to implement an internal optimization plan, and this is, in Loredana > Apreutese's opinion, the main challenge for the next period.

In the fifth place in the assets top is XPO Transport Solutions, with €41,892,549, the decrease of 19% bringing in this case a drop with two places compared to the previous year. The following four positions are occupied by Total NSA, with assets of €30,219,195 in 2018, up 5% compared to 2017, when it occupied the eighth position, Tir Express, with €28,963,295, 2% over the value of the assets in 2017, when it was the ninth company in this ranking, Duvenbeck, with €24,877,112, with a 23% increase which brought a quite spectacular rise in the ranking, from the 16th place in 2017 to the eighth in 2018, and Arcese Transport, with €24,688,271, down 2% compared to 2017, when it was in 11th position.

In the 10th place is Transpeco, with assets of €23,978,611 in 2018, slightly rising from the €18,640,018 in 2017. The fixed assets had increases due to extension of the fleet, the intangible assets have increased due to the bigger investments in software licenses, the current assets have not been significantly changed and the debts have also slightly increasing as payment terms have been increasing in recent years, reaching 30 or even 60 days. As for the assets abandoned in 2018, there are some old transport units and the location in laşi (the garage and the office), which had no activity anymore.

In 11th place is Skiptrans, with
€21,880,083. The subsidiary of the Belgian
company Jost does not retire from Romania,
but it continues the investments in a logistics
base on the 6 ha land purchased near the
airport in Cluj-Napoca, where the current
offices will be moved and warehouses will
also be built for cross-docking, but also for
storing the goods collected in groupages,
which can then go abroad. In the same
location the company plans to build a
service and a truck wash, which will provide
services for third parties.

The 12th position, as in 2017, is occupied by Romstyl, with €20,786,755, down 13% from the €23,928,983 in the previous year.

On the 13th place in assets top is

Dianthus, with €20,611,925, compared to
€21,797,625 in 2017, when it occupied the
14th position. The value was slightly lower
also due to the sale of some trucks, but also
to the depreciation of the goods, given that
the fixed assets have increased steadily in
recent years, through the annual increase of
the fleet.

The 14th and 15th places are occupied by Euro Fleet Transport, with €20,442,241, 6% above the €19,196,624 in 2017, when the company was 17th, respectively by Trameco, increasing by 15%, from €17,574,891 to €20,159,452 and rising from the 20th place occupied in 2017. On the 16th position is Vos Logistics Cargo, with €20,124,496, compared to €18,464,960 in 2017. The company invested in 2018 over €46 million, including here, among others, the acquisition of 400 trucks and 480 new semi-trailers and state-of-the-art on-board computers, which, in combination with the driver training, helps improve safety by reducing the number of technical errors and damages, reduces the fuel consumption and increases the comfort of the driver. In addition, the offices have been moved into a modern space, which involved an investment of about €250,000.

The last four positions in Top 20 by assets are occupied by companies that were not in Top 20 in 2017: Holleman Special Transport & Project Cargo, with €19,139,040, a substantial increase, by 54%, compared to the €12,462,389 in 2017, Dunca Expediții, with €18,813,238, also a significant increase, with 33%, compared to 2017, Trans Euro Express 94, with €17,795,903, 2% more than in 2017, and Ravitex, with €17,593,808, 1% more than in 2017. Thus, out of the companies in

► Top 20 in terms of assets, 15 registered increases compared to 2017, ranging from 1% to 54%, and five decreased by 1% to 19%.

The difference between receivables and debt is slightly higher than in 2017 for the Top 20

The first 20 transport companies in the ranking that takes into account the difference between receivables and debts have in total €46,510,285, compared to €39,997,007 the first 20 companies in 2017. 13 of the first 20 operators in this top in 2018 appear in the Top 20 in 2017, and seven are new entries in Top 20, which means, of course, that seven companies from 2017 no longer appear in the 2018 top: Vos Logistics, Trans Bitum, Wiedmann & Winz International Shipping, Lubbers, Anasped, Transconstruct Co. Snagov and Hagero.

The leader of this ranking is, as in 2017, Duvenbeck, with €8,767,794, 8% above the €8,105,697 in 2017, followed by Skiptrans, with €4,498,328, 285% more than the €1,168,498 in 2017, when he was 16th, and Carpat Cemtrans, with €3,368,315, 28% less than the €4,685,129 in 2017, when it ranked second. Vectra Logistic, in fourth place in 2018, has dropped a position compared to 2017, although the difference between receivables and debts increased by 3%, from €2,510,166 to €2,573,800. Hartl Carrier climbed three places, up to the fifth, due to a 50% increase, from €1,713,317 to €2,562,894.

Felbermayr follows in this ranking, with €2,492,252, up 2% compared to 2017, when it was in fourth place, then Kenwroth Transport, with €2,486,507, 15% above the value in 2017, when it was on fifth place, Van Mieghem Transport, with €2,317,353, 17% more than in the previous year, when it was on the sixth place, Cat-lon, with €2,115,845, 61% above the value of 2017, and Microfruits, in 10th place, with €1,753,612, 136% more than in 2017, when it was not in Top 20.

In the second part of the standings, the 11th place belongs to Vio Transgrup, with

€1,721,251, 2% less than in 2017, when it was on the seventh place, on the 12th, climbing three places compared to 2017, is Cesped, with €1,655,508, 41% over the previous year, the 13th company, as in 2017, is Adomin, with €1,648,310, 30% over the previous year, on the 14th, KLG Trucking, with €1,603,639, 117% over the value of 2017, and on the 15th is Aguaki Trans, with €1,537,372, 361% more than in 2017 - the last two companies were not in the Top 20 in 2017.

The ranking ends with K.S.T. Vervoer, with €1,388,547, 16% more than in 2017, but dropping two places, Rumaran, with €1,318,531, a company that in 2017 had a very negative value, of -1,230,248 euros, Gazquez Transport, with €1,303,268, 692% more than in 2017, Express Euroscan, with €1,248,556, 10% less than in 2017, when it was in 10th place, and H.Essers, with €1,235,515, 58% more than in 2017 - the last four companies were not in 2017 in Top 20 realised by the difference between receivables and debts.

Higher degree of capitalization and high return on equity

Confidas platform made an analysis of the road transport market in Romania, where 34,600 companies operate, which filled a balance sheet, but many of them are inactive or have only 1-3 trucks, so the analysis took into account only those with more than 100,000 lei turnover. And the conclusion was that it increased in 2018 by 12% compared to 2017, from 41.6 to 46.6 billion lei total turnover, after the 13-14% increase in 2017 compared to 2016. The first 50 companies in terms of turnover represent 20% of the entire industry, and the average turnover/firm is €250,000. 62% of the operators in this field registered an increase in revenues in 2018, the degree of capitalization increased, but not too much,

from 16% to 18%, proving the long-term commitment and the confidence of the financiers, and the value of the return of the own capital remains high, 32%, although down from 35% in 2017.

The number of employees in this industry was 147,000 at the end of last year, compared to 135,000 in 2017, which means an average of six employees/firm, given that 54% of the companies had an increase in the number of employees last year.

70% of the active companies have profit, and the average duration of debt collection has decreased from 75 to 74 days.

56% of the transport companies have medium and high risk of insolvency

If above we have the strengths of the transport industry, the vulnerabilities identified by Confidas analysis include the fact that 46% of the companies have a debt level of more than 80%, the debts being close to or greater than their own capital, that 37% have a liquidation current below which indicates liquidity pressures, that 63% of the debts are current liabilities, and 45% of the firms have only short-term debts, which shows a financing horizon focused mainly on short-term (long-term orientation would mean investments in order to have future returns). In addition, 60% of the companies recorded a decrease in net profit in 2018, from 6.5% to 5.5%, the payment terms to suppliers increased from 109 to 110 days, and 56% of the companies have the risk insolvency, ConfiRisk, above the average risk, which is 1-6 - the average in transport is 6.12 out of 10. The lowest average insolvency risk in Romania, 9.40%, is held by the companies from Tulcea, followed by those from Iași (10.60%) and Vaslui (10.90%), and the highest is in Bucharest and Ilfov (27%), followed by Caras Severin, with 25.30% and Timis, with 23.20%.



Top 25 Global Freight Forwarders

Good profits, but smaller volumes for ocean and air transport

The global forwarding market achieved good financial gains in 2018 and the main players continued to invest in network and operations optimization, but the volumes declined for ocean and air transport. DHL Global Freight Forwarding is the main player in this field, as we may see in Armstrong & Associates Inc's rankings, but a lot of analysts believe that Kuehne + Nagel surpassed DHL as the leader in this market, because in 2018 this company achieved an 11.7% increase in net turnover, 9.8% in gross profits and 5.3% in EBIT. Its ocean volumes increased by 7.7%, air increased by 11% and the company also made significant investments in technologies and acquisitions.

he ranking is flexible in its final part and there may be more room for new players to enter the rankings, since CJ Logistics and NNR Global Logistics fell off the list in 2018 and were replaced by Logwin and Mainfreight.

The freight forwarding market is concentrating more on the small-to medium-sized business segments. For example, Agility has introduced online platforms and other services to focus on this growing segment, UPS and FedEx have introduced fulfillment services and Amazon is playing a bigger role in attracting more third-party sellers to its platform by offering logistics and freight forwarding services. And niche solution providers, such as perishables and

healthcare, are expected to attract forwarders looking to expand their industry specific services.

Since this ranking appeared, Kuehne + Nagel has expanded its overland capabilities with the acquisition of Austrian SME Jöbstl, a move that would benefit shippers seeking capacity into Eastern Europe and groupage services. Transport operations, especially the connections to neighbouring countries, will be strengthened, while increasing the frequency of departures and shortening lead-times, as the representatives of Kuehne + Nagel declare.

Another impressive leap was made by C.H. Robinson, from 13th in 2017 to 9th in 2018, due especially to a high demand for ocean cargo - a very strong sector for this company.



Three regions managed to exceed the one billion thresholds in transport. Logistics seems less profitable.

The top 500 companies in transport and logistics sector were divided into six development regions according to the county. Not surprisingly, the same regions that had the best result in transport, performed well also in logistics sector, but only less profitable. Muntenia, Transylvania and Maramureş, Banat and Crişana are the regions with the highest turnover, over one billion from transport services. The turnover for Moldavia, Oltenia and Dobrogea is lower. In transport sector, Muntenia region is followed by Transylvania and Maramureş from turnover point of view, and Banat and Crişana region comes on third position. Regarding the logistics sector, Muntenia maintains first position, but Banat and Crişana region is the second runner-up, thus Transylvania ranks the third position.

ccording to the data provided by Coface, there are 31,437 companies activating in transport sector (CAEN Code 4941), around 2% of the total number of economic agents in Romania. Out of this number 5,682 had no financial activity in 2018. All transport companies reported a turnover of almost RON 45.794 billion (around €9.85 billion) for 2018. 14,924 companies reported a turnover in the range €0-100,000, meaning half of the total agents on the market. 7,741 economic agents had a turnover ranging from €100,000 up to €500,000, only 1,550 companies went up to one million and 1,284 agents had a turnover fitting between €1 and €1.5 million.

As the turnover goes higher, there is a drop of the number of companies ranging in that class. So, there are only 140 companies that managed to accumulate a turnover of €5-10 million and 109 companies fitted in the range of €10-50 million. Five companies had a turnover of €50-100 million, and only two companies managed to exceed the €100 million threshold.

The top 10 transport companies provided 8% of the cumulative turnover of the sector, meaning RON 3.666 billion (approximately €788.28 million).

Regarding the logistics sector, also according to Coface, there are 1,701 economic agents and out of these 297 had no activity in 2018. 535 companies accumulated a turnover below €100,000. 433 agents reported a turnover of €100,000-500,000 and there were 156 companies in the range €500,000-1,000.000. A few more companies, namely 212, registered a turnover in the range €1-5 million and 33 agents fit in the range €5-10 million.

28 companies managed to record a turnover of €10-50 million. 6 of the agents activating in the sector went from €50 million up to €100 million and only one managed to exceed €100 million.

The total turnover of the logistics sector (CAEN Code 5229 - Other activities related to transport) was of approximately RON 9.840 billion (€2.116 billion) and almost one third of this turnover - 32% - was the contribution of the first 10 companies (€673.69 million).


Regarding the development regions, although comparable from turnover point of view, the profit accumulated by the companies activating in Muntenia was higher compared to Transylvania, one of the reasons being the fact that the latter region is populated with local subsidiaries of important multinationals. In the Southern

area of Romania transport services are supplemented by logistics services and, very important, there are many Romanian capital transport operators who do not repatriate any profit elsewhere. These companies are also the ones that have the biggest assets on the market of transport and logistics.

Muntenia Region - consisting of Arges, Teleorman, Giurgiu, Dâmboviţa, Prahova, Ilfov, Calăraşi, Ialomiţa, Buzău, Brăila counties and Bucharest - counts 149 transport companies present in Top 500. These companies registered a €1.59 billion turnover; almost half was the contribution of the first 20 companies. 13% of the total turnover was reported by Aquila Part Prod Com. 15 companies out of 149 recorded losses in 2018.

The profit reported by the remaining 134 companies reached €62.66 million in 2018 (up from €59.36 million in 2017). Only 16 transport operators managed to cross the one million euro profit threshold.

226 companies in top 500 logistics operators are from Muntenia region. These operators have reported a turnover of €1.39 billion for 2018 (€1.3 billion in 2017), more than half of the total turnover of the top 500 (€2.17 billion). 29 operators have reported losses for the financial year 2018. The remaining 197 operators have had a profit of €49.24 million, decreasing from €49.94 million. Almost €30 million was the contribution of the companies ranking the first 20 positions.



Although Muntenia enjoys the presence of most multinational logistics operator, it seems that transport companies are more profitable, with an average profit of half million euro per company, compared to a quarter of a million, the profitability per each logistic operator.

Transport offers better profitability for companies in Transylvania and Maramures

Almost one third of the companies in top 500 come from the counties belonging to Transylvania and Maramureş region - Braşov, Covasna, Harghita, Mureş, Salaj, Hunedoara, Sibiu, Alba, Bistriţa-Nāṣāud, Cluj, Maramureş and Satu Mare - namely 158. These reported for 2018 a turnover of €1.54 billion compared to €1.41 billion in 2017.

In top 20, there are 11 companies from Cluj County. Carrion Expedition, one of the most important presences in the region in the past, didn't report the financial data at the Ministry of Public Finance. Without Carrion, all 158 companies in this region registered in 2018 a profit of €40.63 million compared to €39.87 million in 2017.

87 companies from Transylvania and Maramureş are present in top 500 logistics operators. Their cumulative turnover reached ▶

► €176.47 million. 62.72% (€121.27 million) was the contribution of the first 20 operators.

Atlas Imobiliare ranks first both as turnover (€27.75 million) and profit (€1.45 million) point of view. It was actually the only company that managed to exceed the 1 million euro profit threshold, offering also 20% of the entire profit of the companies that got into top 500. Only 73 of these companies reported a profit of €7.38 million and 14 operators reported negative results.

One fifth of the transport and logistics operators in top 500 are from Banat and Crisana region

In top 500, one fifth of the ranking is represented by the companies from Banat and Crisana Region - Arad, Bihor, Timis, Caraş-Severin - exactly 109 operators. These companies reported a turnover of €1.19 billion for 2018 compared to €1.03 billion recorded the previous year. Half of this turnover is the contribution of the companies ranking the first 20 positions. There was no company from Caraş-Severin County to rank in top 20. By the way, there are only three companies from Caras-Severin present in top 500 (Mercur International, Liverani and Res Vipiteno Logistica, with a turnover around €5 million. These 109 companies had a profit of €29.22 million, decreasing from €31.87 million in 2017.

99 companies from Banat and Crişana region represent the logistics sector in top 500. Their turnover reached €420.18 million in 2018, increasing from €400.70 million in 2017. €322.92 million was the contribution of the operators ranking top 20, meaning 76.85% of the turnover registered by the operators present in top 500. 20% of the cumulative turnover was the contribution of Transmec Ro (€85.12 million), the company that ranked first also from profit point of view with €2.34 million, meaning 17.94% of the total profit of €13.08 million reported by 81

companies from this region. 18 operators reported negative results.

Moldova offers better ground for transport

In Top 500 transport companies analysed by Tranzit magazine from financial performance point of view, from Moldavia region, consisting of Iaşi, Botoşani, Neamt, Suceava, Bacâu, Vaslui, Vrancea and Galaţi counties, there were 53 companies. These companies recorded in 2018 a turnover of €348.47 million, showing a 24% growth compared to the situation in 2017 (€263.60 million).

More than half of this value, €212.07 million, represents the contribution of the first 20 companies from the counties mentioned above. Suceava and laşi are the leads with six companies for each county present in this ranking.

Out of 53 companies from Moldavia, only 49 registered profit in 2018, the total value of their profit being €10.497 million. Moldova region profit declined slightly from €10.97 million registered in 2017. The top 20 companies in the region accumulated a profit of €8.8 million. Express Euroscan was the only company with a profit exceeding one million euro, according to the financial data from Ministry of Public Finance.

Out of 500 logistics operators analysed by Tranzit, only 25 are from Moldavia region, and they managed to reach a €60.76 million turnover last year. 3 companies (out of 25)

So, taking into account the turnover and profit of the companies activating in transport and logistics in this region, it seems Moldavia offers a better climate for transport. At least for the moment, because in the last two years most of the national forwarders and logistics operators consider Bacau, Roman or lasi as hubs of the region for a cross-dock center.

Oltenia was better represented by transport

Oltenia Region comprises five counties:
Gorj, Dolj, Olt and Vålcea, but only 17
companies made it to the TOP 500, with
a cumulative turnover of €112.85 million
(€103.40 million in 2017). Mehedinți County
is also part of this region, but no company
has made to the 500 ranking. One third of the
turnover was the contribution of Dumagas
Transport (€35.77 million). Only 16 companies
out of 17 present in top 500 managed to
record profit. The profit was about €3.52
million in 2018, slightly decreasing compared
to €3.90 million reported for 2017.

19 logistics operators in Oltenia have entered the top 500, with a cumulative turnover of €36.35 million, €9.09 million being the contribution of Marvi Logistic, the company ranking the first position from the turnover point of view. All the companies from Oltenia have accumulated in 2018 a profit of €2.73 million (€2.24 million in 2018).

Tulcea offers little perspectives for transport and logistics operators

Dobrogea Region, consisting of Constanta and Tulcea counties, had only nine companies present in top 500. These reported a turnover of €80.37 million compared to €59.54 in 2017. BKN TIR LINE is the only

presence form Tulcea. On the other hand, J.T. GRUP OIL managed to offer 45% of the total turnover.

The profit registered by these companies increased from €2.46 million in 2017 to €3.2 million in 2018.

Dobrogea enjoins the presence of 33 logistics operators in top 500, all of them being from Constanța. Their turnover reached €72.54 million in 2018 (from €70.32 million in 2017). Aries Logistics offered 19.11% (€13.86 million) of the total turnover of the region.

Only 30 companies reported profit in 2018, approximately €5.9 million, increasing from €5.3 million in 2017.

The results are very poor taking into account that Constanta is one of the largest harbours in region and should have offered more opportunities for development at least for logistics. On the contrary, we see that the top transport companies in the region developed more due to the transport activity inside EU community.



Romania's industrial market is likely to stay hot in 2020 by riding a wave of demand

The industrial and logistics market in Romania is currently enjoying its best period in history, both in terms of supply and demand, doubling its total stock during the past five years, according to the data provided by real estate consultancy companies reports. Industrial market reached highs that led more developers to get into the game. At the end of the third quarter of 2019, the stock of A and B class industrial spaces reached 4.3 million sq.m.

he H1 2019 property investment volume for Romania is estimated at almost €338 million, a value almost 64% higher than the one registered in the same period in 2017 (€205 million). However, there are a number of transactions in different stages of negotiations that will most likely be concluded during the remainder of 2019 or 2020.

The macro-economic forecast for Romania continues to be positive, despite some recent concerns. The country was one of the EU's top performer in 2018 (with GDP growth estimated at 4.1%) and it is expected to continue its positive evolution in 2019 as well, with GDP increase forecast at over 4.0%. On the financing side, terms and conditions are getting closer to what can be expected in the core CEE markets. Consequently, the market feeling is strong, with a total volume for 2019 estimated to surpass the €1.2 billion milestone.

The most important industrial transaction

was the acquisition of a logistic park on the A1 Highway, at the kilometre 13, the most important sub-market in Bucharest.

Bought by CTP from Vabeld Group for approximately €40 million, the deal consolidated the

position of CTP as one of the largest owners of industrial/logistic space in Romania. The developer already owns other three properties in the vicinity of Bucharest. The transaction was concluded in June 2019.

For 2019, many new projects were announced on the industrial and logistics segment, for example ELI Park 1 Chitila, MLP Bucharest West, Global Logistics Chitila, Black Sea Vision Constanta, ONE Ploiești Logistic Park, P3 Bucharest NW Ring Road, CTPark Sibiu II, WDP Buzău, TRC Park Bacău etc.

To these new projects there were added extensions of existing parks, and "here we can mention CTPark Bucharest West, WDP Ştefăneşti, WDP Dragomireşti, P3 Bucharest A1, Global Logistics Timişoara (former TAP), Network Industrial Park Sibiu, Southern Industrial Park Craiova, Olympian Park East Bucharest, Olympian Park Braşov, NGB Distribution Center Bragadiru etc.", explained Costin Bănică, head of Industrial Department

Romania doubled its industrial stock in half a decade

The industrial and logistics market in Romania doubled its total stock during the past five years.

The stock of A and B class industrial spaces reached 4.3 million sq.m at the end of the first nine months of 2019, following the July-September period, when approximately 186,000 sq.m were completed in 11 industrial projects. According to CBRE Research data, an additional area of 75,000 sq.m of industrial space will be delivered in seven projects by the end of the year, of which about 72% has already been pre-rented.

Bucharest currently has a stock of industrial and logistics spaces of around 1.8 million sq.m, with a share of 50% in the total national stock, the capital city being followed by Timişoara (500,000 sq.m), Ploieşti (350,000 sq.m), Cluj-Napoca (280,000 sq.m) and Piteşti (235,000 sq.m).

In the first six months of 2019, new industrial and logistics spaces with an area of 200,000 sq.m were delivered, with Bucharest accounting for 57% of the total (115,000 sq.m). followed by Slatina (62,000 sq.m), Oradea (34,000 sq.m) and Timişoara, with almost 22,300 sq.m traded.

With respect to the second part of the year, new projects totalling 300,000 sq.m are expected, developers thus maintaining the impressive expansion rate that has been the main characteristic of the industrial and logistics market during the last five years.

"The first semester of 2019 has been a dynamic one in terms of leasing transactions of industrial and logistics spaces, totalling 235,000 sq.m. Bucharest remains the most attractive location, both in terms of total stock and the transactions concluded. We have also noticed that important transactions were closed in Slatina, where Pirelli will expand its production area by 62,000 sq.m, and in Oradea, a city where the supplier of auto components Sogefi will expand its activity. These transactions highlight both the potential of such cities that were not among the top destinations sought after by major developers and tenants and also of the market in general, this positive trend being expected to continue in the coming years", said Rodica Târcavu, Partner, Industrial Agency, Cushman & Wakefield Echinox.

Given the developments in the first half of the year, JLL's expectations for 2019 demand are optimistic, so there is expected a volume of transactions comparable to the one recorded over the past 3 years, around 500,000 sq.m.

"But we have to consider two aspects that can influence the level of demand. The first is that the industrial market has reported a record take-up over the last three years, especially amid the expansion of retailers and logistics. The second element is that most of the logistics companies have already consolidated their operations to meet the increased volume of goods generated by the rise in consumption in recent years", explained Costin Banica.

However, there might be an increase in demand for manufacturing and industrial premises, especially from companies active in the automotive sector. Noteworthy that over H1 2019 more than half of the demand (121,600 sq.m) came from manufacturing companies, most of them in the automotive field. "The automotive sector is experiencing a transition to the production of components for electric vehicles. Romania could take advantage of this transition and could attract major investments from big companies for this kind of production premises. In this context, we anticipate an increase in the demand for production areas in 2020-2022", added Costin Banica.

Tenants migrate from old industrial platform to modern projects

According to JLL Romania, another trend seen on the market in 2019 and which generates part of the demand is the migration of the companies from the spaces they are occupying on former industrial platforms to modern projects.

"We are seeing a growing interest from developers to build smaller projects of 1,500-3,000 sq.m, willing to accommodate rising demand from companies moving their operations from old industrial platforms to modern industrial projects. This migration is based, on one hand, on the desire of companies to provide employees with better working conditions and, on the other hand, it is determined by the stricter regulations related to the fire safety authorization", added Costin Banica.

Railway and port accessibility make Romania a great destination for Asian companies which are looking for a better European presence, and our country has a very good connection with the West, Dunwell specialists reveal." We had meetings with several Asian companies - from India to big business centres such as Hong-Kong or Shanghai - all of them interested in investing in Romania, due to its great connection to railway and sea transportation means. Constanța could become an important business hub for such investors in the coming years, mainly from Asian companies who aim for a more significant presence in Europe", said Daniel Cautis, managing partner Dunwell.

Industrial market is driven by three emerging trends

Three trends connect 2018, 2019 and 2020. E-commerce and inner city logistics continue to gain ground. New developers (local and international) have joined the competition and exploring new locations has become a must.

Supply growth went up by 30% year-to-year, which takes us to a total of roughly 3.5 million sq.m by the end of 2018. Market leader CTP advanced with 60% of all new supply, while WDP was number one in terms of new preleases.

WDP will expand the existing production facility of automotive tyre producer Pirelli, with a newly built state-of-the-art warehouse spanning approximately 62,000 sq.m. After completion, scheduled for the second quarter of 2020, Pirelli will lease the new logistics facility for a fixed term of fifteen years. The investment budget amounts to around €40 million. The site in Paulești is underway for a new distribution centre for Iron Mountain, measuring around 10,500 sq.m, with phased delivery by the fourth quarter of 2021. Iron Mountain will lease the premises for a twelve-year term. The investment budget for WDP comes to approximately €4.5 million. Telecom provider Toya will move into a new distribution centre of about 8,600 sq.m under a long-term ten-year lease in WDP Stefanestii de Jos. The developer projects an investment of €3.5 million. Located in the Western part of the country in Oradea, WDP will build and lease a new warehouse of around 34,000 sq.m for the automotive supplier Sogefi, under a fifteen-year lease. WDP projects an investment budget of around €16 million.

P3 also announced their second industrial park near A1 highway, in the North-Western part of the ring road. VGP and Zacaria were active as well in the region of Timisoara, Brasov, Sibiu and Craiova.

 VGP has constructed 111,000 sq.m in Timisoara and other 16,000 sq.m in VGP Park Sibiu.

The initial VDP park in Sibiu is divided into 3 buildings. The middle

one is fully constructed and it has a total surface of 16,000 sq.m, and approximatley 3,000 sq.m were leased by Engelmayer. The total VGP Park Sibiu will have 44,000 sq.m with possibility of further extension.

As a novelty, P3 has launched a multifunctional project that includes a 212-bed hostel, with the possibility of extension, for temporary or permanent employees and a canteen. The building is located in the center of the logistics park and P3 has the possibility to add other service components in the future. The developer is thinking also of a supermarket, cafe and medical services. With this project the company tried to meet the urgent need of labour force of its tenants. Bucharest, where the connections of the A3 highway was finalized.

Demand came close to 0.7 million sq.m in 2018, where only 22.5% were renewals and renegotiations, most transactions being concluded for new premises. 24% of the total number of transactions was sealed by logistics companies, the demand being concentrated in Bucharest (60%), with Timişoara coming in second (9%) and Deva in third (8%). Retailers represent 42% of all market transactions, while eMAG decided to build its own 120,000 sq.m premises.

2018 closed with a 5% vacancy rate in Bucharest and only slightly higher in the rest of the country.

Average headline rent in Bucharest and neighboring area stands at €3.5-4.1/sq.m and €3.3-4.1/sq.m in the regional cities. "We do not expect significant changes for 2020", added Costin Bānicā.

But competitive rent levels, more flexibility or incentives were expected to characterize the 2019 leasing market.

The supply could expand by an additional 750,000 sq.m in 2019, 41% being under construction at the beginning of the year, and 35% of the area was located in Bucharest, where major A Class projects were about to rise from new developers such as MLP Group, Element Industrial or Global Vision.

We are likely to witness new projects appearing in Craiova, Constanta, Buzāu, Bacāu and even laşi, as we expect to see more activity in these places in the following years.




